AGVISE now in Benson

An agricultural advising service, which was organized in North Dakota three years the has located a branch in Benson and already is operating in preparation for the 1979 crop season.

AGVISE, Ltd. with readquarters in Northwood, v. C., and in operation since lune 1976, is currently located in the small, white building behind McCarthy Lumber, ast Highway 12, Benson.

It was Tuesday, Jan. 30, that GVISE originally visited senson and at that time anounced there was the ossibility of locating here, hich would mark the corpation's third rural location. In addition to headquarters 'Northwood, AGVISE also is cated in Cooperstown, N. D.

ohn Nordgaard, 26, a live of Bottineau, N. D., and 970 graduate of high school re, is in charge of Benson livrations, saying he will rtly add a secretary and or two pest management chalists to handle business provide service.

ordgaard said AGVISE, will be located behind arthy Lumber for the probably within a year.

"We've had a lot of requests out of this area ever since we started in 1976 in Northwood," answered Nordgaard, asked why AGVISE located her. "We've had people from this area that have called us and it's kinda a natural for us. because you have very similar crops here as we have in North Dakota.

"That was a couple of the reasons. Also, we knew a couple people in this area. We evaluated this town and several other towns around, but things just seemed to click

a little better in this area and that's why we're here."

One of the persons responsible for enticing AGVISE to Benson was Duaine Flanders, a member of the District 777 faculty, a Benson councilman, a past president of the Benson Chamber of Commerce and member of the future development committee, plus a part time farmer himself.

He first learned of AGVISE while attending a meeting last fall with Leon Carlson, District 777 ag instructor. After the meeting Flanders had an opportunity to speak with Nordgaard and Dr. Ed Lloyd, AGVISE president.

Flanders said he was most impressed by the AGVISE presentation that day and then the discussion with Nordgaard and Dr. Lloyd.

"They were very sincere and seemed and appeared to be very dedicated to their job," explained Flanders. "I looked on it (AGVISE locating here) as being a very favorable thing for the community, because I found out they were investigating coming to the west central
